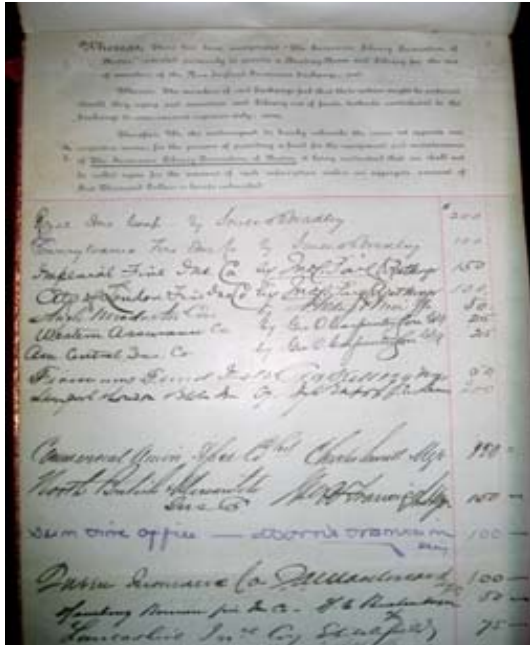
Education Programs

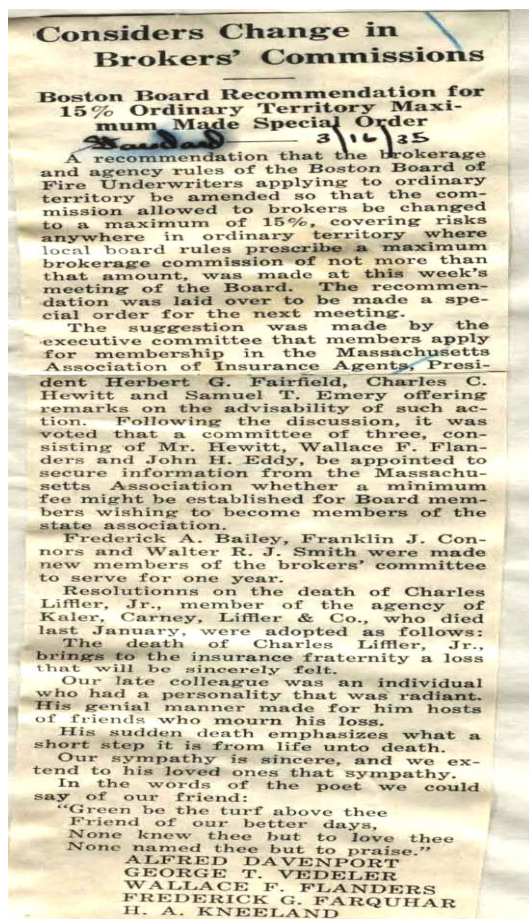
And The Next Day it Rained...
